Equal Pay Day - Tuesday April 12, 2016

AAUW- Michigan State Convention - Saturday April 30 in Troy Michigan at the Somerset Inn.

Highlights include Leadership Training workshops, a keynote by US Representative Brenda Lawrence, Public Policy sessions dealing with ERA, Title IX, Campus Safety, Get out the Vote, the Lobby Corps and Government Relations.

Humbly, I will tell you that I will be receiving the Martha Griffiths Equity Award, Penny Larsen having nominated me. Oh, please join me in Troy. AAUW Action Fund Congressional Voting Record released for first session 114th Congress

Senate members were scored on five legislative actions including co-sponsorship of the Paycheck Fairness Act, the Survivors Outreach and Support (SOS) Campus Act, the Democracy for All Constitutional Amendment to overturn Citizens United. Seven Senators received a 100% rating for AAUW supported issues. We are proud to say our Michigan Senator Gary Peters is among the seven. Senator Debbie Stabenow scored 83%, in that she voted against the Campus Act.

The House of Representatives was scored on similar issues: Support for The Paycheck Fairness Act, Democracy for All and opposition to both the Every Student Succeeds Act which fails to hold states accountable for closing achievement gaps, the reauthorization of Scholarship for Opportunity and Results which expands school vouchers to private schools that do not follow Title IX guidelines and which also divert public school funding. AAUW opposed the Defund Planned Parenthood Act which limited women's access to health care and scored legislators on this vote as well. There were 59 members of the U.S. House of Representatives scoring 100%. Sad to say, our Representative Dan Benishek scored 14%. His last score on the last Congressional Voting Record was 0%. He did support Human Trafficking legislation in this session.
