This year it will be followed by a Community Conversation "Restoring Trust in State Government" across the street at Peter White Public Library's Community Room at **7:00 PM**

The Marquette Branch of American Association of University Women (AAUW) and Peter White Public Library are cohosting this Community Conversation in partnership with the Center for Michigan. This program at PWPL's community room is open to the public.

During this event, participants will be asked about barriers to trusting state government. What would it take to improve trust? Topics will include government services, management of the public purse and oversight of Michigan's political system. This is not intended to be a gripe session, but a constructive dialogue. The Center for Michigan will facilitate the discussion and will take the issues and solutions discussed to state leaders.
