Public Policy News - August 2019



Mary Pollock (center in photo), AAUW of Michigan Government Relations Coordinator came to town and met with Marquette branch members (left to right) Karlyn Rapport. Leslie Warren, Pat Micklow, Elizabeth Miller, and Jackie Stark (not pictured).

They had breakfast and a most interesting discussion on August 3. Mary shared her perspective on the political climate in Lansing. Topics addressed included the Republican lawsuit challenging the state's redistricting. Mary encouraged AAUW members to apply to the commission which will work on redistricting. We will keep you informed. No hearing dates were set, but this case was assigned to Judge Janet Neff.

Mary applied for the national AAUW Public Policy Committee and received notice that she had been selected. This is an honor and a wonderful opportunity.

We talked of two abortion method ban bills—one criminalizing dilation and extraction abortions, the safest and most effective method in the second trimester and the other, the so-called Heartbeat bill. Mary thinks that Right to Life can obtain the necessary 300,000 valid signatures. And unfortunately, it is likely this anti-choice legislation would pass our present anti-choice legislature bypassing the governor's veto.

Andrea Geralds–Taylor is heading an effort to push back against these two anti abortion petitions. Pledge to Repeal is a political action committee looking to keep current abortion practices legal. If either anti-abortion measure makes it to the Legislature and is passed, Pledge to Repeal has a 90-day window to gather enough signature to put the law up for a referendum. Andrea Geralds-Taylor will be a guest speaker at our Lobby corps conference call on September 16 at 7:30 PM.

Stay tuned for an official flyer, but Amy wanted us to hold the date while AAUW-Traverse City figures out the workshop details.



AAUW-National has a **Shape the Future Membership Campaign**, which is a recruitment tool for current members to offer a discounted rate to prospective members who sign up at public events. All of our monthly program events are open to the public. With the Shape the Future Membership Campaign, new members pay just 50% of the national dues rate when they join AAUW at a public event. Branches also earn one free national membership to give away for every two newly recruited members, with a maximum of three free memberships annually.

AAUW national dues are almost entirely tax deductible. Regular AAUW national dues are \$59, of which \$56 is tax deductible; \$3 of the national dues payment is not tax deductible because it supports the AAUW Action Fund's section 501(c)(4) Lobby Corps and election-related activities. Discounted dues through Shape the Future are only \$29.50, of which \$26.50 is tax deductible; \$3 of the national dues payment is not tax deductible.

Who Is Eligible for AAUW Membership?

AAUW membership is open to anyone with an associate or equivalent degree (e.g., RN) or higher from a regionally accredited institution. A "new member" is someone entirely new to AAUW or an individual who rejoins after two or more years of non-membership. A national member who joins a branch is not a new member. "New members" are the only members eligible for the membership discounts through this campaign.
