A review of last month's program: *Equity in Sports*

Our April 2022 AAUW program featured Dr. Marguerite (Maggie) Moore, Lovell Endowed Professor of Athletic Training, Director of the Concussion Research Clinic, and Coordinator of the Training Center. Dr. Moore filled in for Dr. Wuorinen, Associate Dean of the School of Health and Human Performance. We appreciate Dr. Moore's willingness to facilitate our program discussions. Dr. Moore mentioned Title IX protections have been upheld by law since 1972, but discrepancies in equal pay between men and women sports is persistent. College coaches in women's team sports earn 63 cents for every dollar earned by head coaches of men's teams. In 2020, women received only 4% of the total sports media coverage in print and broadcast, even though women make up 40% of persons in sports.

Jenna Chappell, our 2022 Martha Griffiths Award winner, attended the program with her nominator, Dr. Sheena Ketchum from the Anthropology Department. Jenna played on the NMU women's soccer team for two years and noticed a lack of sports coverage for women's sports teams, even during women's sport winning seasons relative to men's sport losing seasons. Jenna suggested NMU and organizations like AAUW could give more attention and appreciation to female athletes for their dedication and hard work.

We asked about pronouns following email signatures and names on Zoom. Dr. Ketchum explained that use of identifying pronouns allows individuals to share their identities respectfully and that misuse of a person's preferred pronouns even accidentally could make a person feel disrespected. I do not know if using identifying pronouns is a step toward equity, but use of identifying pronouns seems to signify a willingness to respect individual differences in social situations. I added my pronouns (she/her) to my Zoom signature during the program.

BREAKING NEWS: Leaked Draft indicates Supreme Court may strike down Roe v Wade

A Ray of Hope

Friday, April 29, 2022, Connecticut's State Senate passed a bipartisan abortion bill 25-9 that increases the

number of medical professionals allowed to perform abortions. The Connecticut House of Representatives previously voted 87-60 for this measure. This bill allows advance practice registered nurses, physicians assistants and nurse midwives to provide medical and aspiration abortions in the first trimester.

In the face of draconian measures passed by states like Texas, Oklahoma, and Louisiana; Connecticut can become a refuge. Medical records of women travelling from other states are protected from subpoena by other states.

We are witnessing a global subjugation of women's rights. Women's rights to own property, have bodily autonomy guaranteed constitutionally, and civil rights for all, propelled democracy globally. Now we are confronted by efforts to restrict discussion of gender and racial equality in public schools. States have increased control of LGBTQ rights. There is an ironic co-opting of "My body My Choice "as the anti-vaccine mantra which puts us all at risk. Largely the same group want to restrict women's access to medical care and ballot access. These issues are inextricably linked to unraveling women's equality.

Our rights are under assault. We need to mobilize We need to invest in feminist candidates and feminist policies. These are fundamentally preserving our fragile democracy. We can't let young women take for granted rights which were hard won. Although the 250 member organizations of the ERA Coalition, including AAUW. asked Majority leader Chuck Schumer to schedule a vote on SJ R 1 to remove the timeline from ERA; he has not done so. The U.S. House of Representatives passed HJR17 on March 22,2022.

The archivist has yet to publish ERA which has been ratified by 38 states as an amendment to the constitution. Merrick Garland has yet to pull the Trump position on ERA and submit the one 200 constitutional scholars endorse. Patriarchy is in power.

Celebrate Connecticut. Sign the Reproductive Freedom for All and the Promote the Vote 2022 petitions and hope they get on the November 2022 ballot. Call US Senator Chuck Schumer at 202-224-6542 and tell him to bring SJR1 to the floor for a vote. Ask him to insist the archivist publish ERA as an amendment to the U.S. Constitution.
