Student Loan Debt: The picture is Changing

President Biden cancelled \$10,000 in student loan debt for almost 8 million students. Recipients of Pell Grants could see a debt reduction of \$20,000, however, only loans from the Department of Education were eligible for this reduction. Earners earning \$125,000 year were eligible for \$10,000. Couples earning \$250,000 were also eligible. The payment and interest pause on student loans was extended to the end of this year. Biden also wanted to lower the percentage of income a borrower pays per month, but he was not able to sell this to Congress. President Biden's efforts have been criticized by some, saying it will increase inflation.

Lowering student debt has been a longstanding concern for AAUW.

Its recommendations to accomplish this are:

- Protect and expand Pell grants for low-income students thus lowering the amount of student loans they take on to obtain a college degree
- 2. Increase funding for public colleges and universities and support efforts to move toward tuition-free and debt-free options.
- 3. Protect students from abusive and fraudulent practices by schools, lenders, and loan services.
- 4. Address other financial needs of students like childcare and non-tuition related expenses.
- 5. Provide matches for employers and other supports for student loan debt payment

Tuition costs have increased over 200% between 2001-2022. This is four times the rate of inflation during this period. Tuition aid has decreased during this same period. Now the average debt from Michigan colleges is \$36,000.

There is good news in Michigan's 2022-2023 state budget. Twenty -five million dollars have been allocated for state-funded college scholarships. Pell grants have increased to \$6895. However, the rising

cost of college tuition results in low-income students racking up more debt or opting out of finishing college. Biden wanted to increase Pell Grants to \$13,000 but Congress would not pass this provision.

Another way to reduce debt is to graduate in fewer semesters. At the very least, we are seeing efforts addressing the burden of student loan debt.

Dates to put on your calendar:

Thursday, September 15, 7 PM

AAUW MI will have a ZOOM presentation on two ballot proposals--Promote the Vote and Reproductive Freedom for All. You can register for this at aauwmi.org. This will be recorded and available on the AAUWMI website. AAUW Michigan endorses both proposals.

There is a real effort to keep the proposals off the **November 8** ballot. Attorneys for Promote the Vote and Reproductive Freedoms for All must submit their rebuttals to the challenges by **August 31**. The Board of Canvassers will make their decision whether to certify these petitions for the November ballot by **Friday**, **September 9**.

Will the Board of Canvassers turn their backs on 670,000 signers of the Promote the Vote petition and 753,739 signatures submitted for the Reproductive Freedom for All petition? All signers are registered voters in Michigan. If these petitions are rejected by the Board of Canvassers, the courts will have to decide.

- Give some thought to ways to make sure people vote.
- Make it a point to talk with your friends and neighbors about voting.
- Is there anything you think our branch could be doing to GOTV [Get Out the Vote]?
